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Heinenoordtunnel A29; closures in July and August 2024. Make sure you're well prepared!

Rijkswaterstaat is renovating the Heinenoordtunnel, part of the A29. The tunnel will be closed in both directions from 10 p.m. Friday 26 July until 5 a.m. Friday 9 August. Be aware that there will be diversions and your journey will probably take longer than normal. Follow the indicated diversions and, if possible, avoid the rush hour.

Closure of the A29 Heinenoordtunnel in both directions

- 10 p.m. Friday 26 July until 5 a.m. Friday 9 August

Diversion

- Through traffic (passenger and freight) will be diverted via the A15, A16 and A17 and vice versa
- Local traffic to and from Hoeksche Waard will be diverted via the A16 and N217 (Kiltunnel) and vice versa.

The Kiltunnel will be toll-free in both directions during this period.

Disruption on the N217 and A16: in the week beginning 8 July and the week beginning 22 July

- Brief traffic holdups at night on the N217 between the Kiltunnel and Oud-Beijerland
- Only 1 lane open in the evening and at night on the A16 between the Drechtunnel and the N3 intersection

Other closures of the A29 Heinenoordtunnel in August

- From midnight on Wednesday 28 August until 5 a.m. on Thursday 29 August, heading towards Bergen op Zoom
- From midnight on Thursday 29 August until 5 a.m. on Friday 30 August, heading towards Rotterdam
- From 10 p.m. on Friday 30 August until 5 a.m. on Monday 2 September, heading towards Rotterdam

Other closures

A29 between Oud-Beijerland and Hellegatsplein junction

- From 10 p.m. on Thursday 4 July until 5 a.m. on Friday 5 July, the A29 will be closed from Oud-Beijerland to the Hellegatsplein junction (Haringvlietbrug). The parallel lane of the Haringvliet Bridge will be open to slow traffic. The Kiltunnel will be toll-free heading towards Dordrecht.
- From 10 p.m. on Monday 8 July until 5 a.m. on Tuesday 9 July, the A29 will be closed from the Hellegatsplein junction (Haringvlietbrug) to the Oud-Beijerland exit. The parallel lane of the Haringvliet Bridge will be open to slow traffic. The Kiltunnel will be toll-free heading towards Hoeksche Waard.

A4 between the Zoomland and Sabina junctions

- from 10 p.m. on Friday 26 July until 5 a.m. on Monday 5 August, the A4 will be closed between the Zoomland and Sabina junctions (heading towards Rotterdam). More information can be found at rijkswaterstaat.nl/onderhoudzn.

A15 from the N3 intersection N3 to the Gorinchem intersection

- from 10:00 p.m. on Friday 9 August until 5.00 a.m. on Friday 16 August, the eastbound carriageway of the A15 will be closed between the intersection with the N3 and the Gorinchem junction. More information is available at rijkswaterstaat.nl.

Height detection at the Heinenoordtunnel from 9 August 2024

The law requires every new or renovated tunnel with a clearance height lower than 4.70 m to be equipped with a height detection system. On the European mainland, the legal maximum height for vehicles is 4 m.

The height of the Heinenoordtunnel will remain the same as before the renovation, but a height detection system will be in operation here from 9 August to comply with legislation. From that date, signs on the A29 will warn drivers of vehicles that are too high. This will allow them to take the following exit and choose a different route.

If a driver ignores all warnings and continues on the same route, they may be fined.

The advice; after loading, measure the height of the vehicle, and make sure that no part of the load protrudes and that the tarpaulins are properly secured. This will prevent the tunnel from closing unnecessarily.
